PSA: Newspaper

Although some of us have begun to subscribe to online periodicals, many of us still get our news and information from newspapers. Once the newspaper has been read about 80% of us will recycle it. If you read through your newspaper closely you may find it contains 30% recycled fiber in it! Other products that you may notice that are made from recycled newspapers include: egg cartons, cereal boxes, grocery sacks, tissue paper, pen and pencil barrels, "kitty" litter, and even cellulose insulation you might find in your home! Rather than recycling you might re-use your newspaper to pack up breakable items or make a homemade piñata! In Richmond you may put your newspapers in a bag and place on top of your Richie Roller for pick up to be recycled. Please do not place inside of container as it is sorted separately at the MRF (material recycling facility). If you are in Richmond and need a container for your recyclable materials call the Richmond Sanitary District at 765-983-7450 and request a blue Richie Roller for your curbside pickup.
